

Contents & Guidelines

Preamble

Commitment to ethical professional conduct is expected of every member (voting members, associate members, and student members) of the Association for Computing Machinery (ACM).

This Code, consisting of 24 imperatives formulated as statements of personal responsibility, identifies the elements of such a commitment. It contains many, but not all, issues professionals are likely to face. Section 1 outlines fundamental ethical considerations, while Section 2 addresses additional, more specific considerations of professional conduct. Statements in Section 3 pertain more specifically to individuals who have a leadership role, whether in the workplace or in a volunteer capacity such as with organizations like ACM. Principles involving compliance with this Code are given in Section 4.

The Code shall be supplemented by a set of Guidelines, which provide explanation to assist members in dealing with the various issues contained in the Code. It is expected that the Guidelines will be changed more frequently than the Code.

The Programmer's Oath

18 November 2015

In order to defend and preserve the honor of the profession of computer programmers,

I Promise that, to the best of my ability and judgement:

- 1. I will not produce harmful code.
- 2. The code that I produce will always be my best work. I will not knowingly allow code that is defective either in behavior or structure to accumulate.
- 3. I will produce, with each release, a quick, sure, and repeatable proof that every element of the code works as it should.
- 4. I will make frequent, small, releases so that I do not impede the progress of others.
- 5. I will fearlessly and relentlessly improve my creations at every opportunity. I will never degrade them.
- 6. I will do all that I can to keep the productivity of myself, and others, as high as possible.I will do nothing that decreases that productivity.
- 7. I will continuously ensure that others can cover for me, and that I can cover for them.
- 8. I will produce estimates that are honest both in magnitude and precision. I will not make promises without certainty.
- 9. I will never stop learning and improving my craft.





The Distribution of Users' Computer Skills: Worse Than You Think




Summary: Across 33 rich countries, only 5% of the population has high computer-related abilities, and only a third of people can complete medium-complexity tasks.


One of usability's most hard-earned lessons is that *you are not the user*. This is why it's a disaster to guess at the users' needs. Since designers are so different from the majority of the target audience, it's not just *irrelevant* what you like or what you think is easy to use — it's often *misleading* to rely on such personal preferences.

For sure, anybody who works on a design project will have a more accurate and detailed mental model of the user interface than an outsider. If you target a broad consumer audience, you will also have a higher IQ than your average user, higher literacy levels, and, most likely, you'll be younger and experience less agedriven degradation of your abilities than many of your users.

There is one more difference between you and the average user that's even more damaging to your ability to predict what will be a good user interface: skills in using computers, the Internet, and technology in general. Anybody who's on a web-design team or other user experience project is a veritable supergeek compared with the average population. This not just true for the developers. Even the less-technical team members are only "less-technical" in comparison with the engineers.
